

September brings with it the celebration of Labor Day and the beginning of the Fall school term. Our culture seems to treat both of these events as just part of an endless parade of once in a lifetime purchasing opportunities. However, **the greatest danger is not purchasing** too many school backpacks or an unnecessary barbecue grill at a discount. The **greatest danger** *is buying into the belief* that our value in life is predicated upon our role as consumers. How do we counter this danger? How do we help our children learn their true value? Perhaps, we consider the wisdom of St. Benedict whose motto is "ora et labora" (prayer and work). How will we be changed if our work is a prayer, an act of thanksgiving for the life we share with others?

The Prayerbook Collect for Labor Day begins with these words: "Almighty God, you have so linked our lives one with another that all we do affects, for good or ill, all other lives: So guide us in the work we do, that we may do it not for self alone, but for the common good; ..." IN MEMORY OF JOE TICHOTA

Caring Father, Good Friend, Loving Grandpa.

Lambert W. "Joe" Tichota, age 87, Joplin, passed away at his home of complications from advanced COPD.

Joe was born August 24, 1934 in West Point, NE, son of the late Joseph L. Tichota and Catherine (Walters) Tichota. He grew up in rural Nebraska and graduated from Beemer High School.



In 1953 he married JoAnn Wegner. Together they raised four children and were married 60 years until JoAnn's death in 2014.

He worked for years in Chemical Plants in Omaha, NE, Lima, OH, and then in 1961 he moved to Joplin and worked many years at Atlas Chemical and Powder Company. He enjoyed working with the youth, loved football, and was a Pee Wee Football Coach for 15 years with the YMCA. He was also involved with local events. As a former Joplin City Council Member for 12 years he championed the causes of the overlooked and less fortunate in the Joplin area.

He loved the sport of horse racing. He owned, bred, trained, and raced Thoroughbred Horses and followed the sport into his later years. Joe worked at Bordertown Casino in Off-Track betting where he met some great friends including Diana Painter, who was an incredible friend and support and who made it possible for him to follow his wishes and stay in his house for the remainder of his life.

He was an active member of the Elks Lodge in the 1970s-80s, and 90s. He has been a member of St. Philip's Episcopal Church in Joplin since 1961.

.He was an avid reader. He was a "dyed in the wool" Democrat and kept a passionate interest in current affairs and politics his entire life.

He kept a jolly demeanor even after facing many adversities.

He was a devoted grandfather who really kept in touch with his two grandchildren. He let them know often that they were loved and was very proud of their activities and accomplishments.

In addition to his parents, Joe was preceded in death by his wife of 60 years, Joann C. (Wegner) Tichota who passed on January 14, 2014, a son, Joel R. Tichota, and a daughter, Julie A. Tichota. Survivors include his daughter, Terry J. Tichota of Las Vegas, NV, and a son, Jon J. Tichota and wife Jennifer Miller of Skokie, IL; grandchildren, Juliana and Lukas Tichota also of Skokie. Surviving siblings are JoAnn Benash of Lincoln, Nebraska, Debra Nolting of Bancroft, Nebraska and Leroy Tichota of Council Bluffs, Iowa.

Memorial services will be held at a later date at St. Philip's Episcopal Church.

Cremation arrangements are under the direction of Parker Mortuary.

MISSION QUEST #1 - TEA WITH TED ON TUESDAY

Who? Ten parishioners (Judy, Hugh & Ramona, Craig & Gayle, Gay, Maridan, John & Nancy, Carol) met with Melinda and Fr. Ted on Tuesday, August 23 for Mission Quest 1 - Tea with Ted. What is this Mission Quest 1?

What? Mission Quest is a meeting in which groups of 12 members share about their involvement at St. Philip's Church, what they value about it, and challenges they see in the present and in the future. We are in the first round of these conversations, hence Mission Quest 1. This was the second group of 12 to meet in the first round. The goal is to have all members participate in a small group to share ideas and plan action over the course of 4 Mission Quest conversations.

What did the group like about the session? These are just a few of the comments on the anonymous surveys. Group size was just right. Open conversation and constructive input. Brought us together to create a stronger, growing church. Issues aired. Most people felt they could participate.

What was a challenge about the session? These are a few of the comments about challenges. Getting past ideas. Too many things to discuss-needed more time. Too many things we need to change quicker.

How can you get involved? The next Mission Quest 1 is on September 18 at 2pm. There are 5 slots open at the time of this writing. Use the QR code posted at church to sign up or call Kim at the office. An October session will be posted soon.

ATTENTION KEYHOLDERS - LOCKS WILL BE CHANGED

Many people have keys to our church. Some keys have been misplaced or lost. The decision was made at the June vestry meeting that the doors entering the parish hall will have the locks rekeyed. This will occur sometime between August 15th and September 1st.



Tighter controls will be implemented regarding key issuance. Those who are known to need a key will automatically receive new keys when they become available. For example, St. Ann's active members will automatically receive a new key from Ramona because they have need to open the building to perform their duties. Others who have frequent need to access the building will receive keys. There will be a check-out system for those who need keys on an occasional basis.

Once the locks have been rekeyed, if you have not received one, but need one, please contact the Parish Office.

In conjunction with this effort the building use policy for the church is currently under review and may be revised/enforced. Signs will be posted on the doors informing all keyholders that the locks will be rekeyed.

KIDS SUNDAY SCHOOL Starts on SEPTEMBER 11 at 9:15AM

KIDS Sunday School starts on Sunday, September 11, at 9:15am. Infants through age 5 will have a Bible story and activity led by the staff in the childcare rooms. Students in grades K-2 and 3-6 will have a lectionary-based curriculum with Bible stories and fun learning activities. K-2 and 3-6 groups will have some shared activities and some separate ones based on age. We will add classes as our number of students and teachers increase. All paid staff and volunteers have passed the required background checks to ensure that St. Philip's activities are safe for everyone. Your child's safety and wellbeing (physically, emotionally and spiritually) is our highest priority.

What is Lectionary Based Sunday School? - The Lectionary is the schedule of Bible readings used for worship each Sunday. Our WHIRL curriculum presents our Kids with the same Bible readings that are used in our Sunday service. This helps families connect with each other and the scripture.

Will there still be Children's Church during the sermon on Sundays? - We intend to continue Children's Church during the sermon in addition to the Sunday School Class before the service. Children's church will continue the learning started in Sunday School, crafts, and music activities. Children return to their families at "The Peace" as we celebrate Holy Communion.



How does all of this happen? All of these vital ministries require faithful adults to serve and make them work. At. St. Philip's Church, we work in teams that serve well, have fun, and share the load. These activities also require funds and financial support from members and friends of the parish who believe in and support our ministries. How is God calling you to support the ministries at St. Philip's Church.

ADULT FORUM AKA STUMP THE PRIEST!

On Sunday, September 11, at 9:15AM, all adults are invited to gather in St. Philip's Parish House for our Adult Forum (AKA also known as Stump the Priest). This weekly event for adults meets during the Sunday School time for infants - Grade 6. Fr. Ted will teach and lead discussions about the Bible, All Things Episcopal, Stewardship, Living a Good Life, and so much more. Many topics will be covered.

QUESTIONS ARE INVITED! - Do you have burning questions? i.e. What's Hell like? Do all dogs go to heaven? Does every cat require an exorcism? Does the Episcopal Church teach Transubstantiation? Fr. Ted enjoys getting adult questions in advance so that good answers and sometimes handouts can be prepared in advance. Of course, he will choose topics like: Prayer, Sacraments, Spiritual Growth, etc., but good adult education answers the questions and needs of the adults involved.

Phyllis Sapp led the invocation.

Agenda - Phil Metz moved to adopt the agenda with amendments, Blake Webster seconded. All in favor, no abstentions. Moved security to 5A.

Last month's vestry minutes – Nancy Messick moved to approve June's minutes; Phil Metz seconded. All in favor, no abstentions.

Security Update - John Moback introduced himself as the new lead on security planning for the church. With 25 years in the army and experience as a trainer for the military in security and emergency procedures, John is well qualified. The plan developed by Ron McConnell will still be in place with adjustments, if needed. John will consult with Fr. Ted about maintaining our welcoming culture while still providing good security.

Treasurer's Report - Our Checking Balance is \$74,056.52. This is down \$13,945.60 year to date. The endowment fund is down, but pledges are up. Income is up for the month approximately \$400.00. Paperwork has been sent to Ron Weil for audit for our regular annual audit. Ron is the CPA for the diocese and there will be no charge for the audit. Quickbooks was purchased through TechSoup using the Diocese number and will be billed \$75.00 annually. We have a 30 day free trial to make sure that it will work for us. Phil Metz moved to approve the Treasure's Report, Maria Dermott seconded. All in favor, no abstentions.

Calendar - <u>Maria Dermott moved to approve with the possibility of amending to remove groups, Phil</u> seconded. All in favor, no abstentions.

Junior Warden Report – Kaie stated that the landscaping had been completed and the front bathrooms toilets were retrofitted to flush better. Talked about the garden area and will have a fall clean up and try again next year. Junior Warden, Kaie, will form a building & grounds committee with the Junior Warden as the vestry representative.

Senior Warden Report – Phil stated that he and Fr. Ted are taking Bishop Diane's husband to Royal's game on Monday. Phil shared the following information about the Finance Committee. We need two signatories on the Stifel Account. The finance committee members are Phil Metz, Jim Paul and Sara Newman. Discussion involved possible expansion to 5 people on the committee to include a wider base of experience. A larger group also maintains some institutional memory when members finish their terms. Will ask that a Finance Committee representative give a regularly scheduled presentation to the vestry of the endowment fund and investments. Whether this report will be quarterly or semi-annually will be determined later.

Rector's Report – see printed report – some highlights: Bunn Coffee Maker was ordered from WebstaurantStore online for \$363.91. Tax exempt form was submitted and will receive a refund for tax of \$24.92. Fr. Ted wants to have an open house in September for our renovated Education Classes and Sunday School Program. Sunday School will start on September 11 as the previous weekend is Labor Day.

Capital Campaign – Ron McConnell stated that there is \$33,742.00 in the account. There has been progress on the upstairs bathrooms. Tile has been installed as well as fixtures. A change in tile used caused a moderate increase in cost. Ron will talk to American Construction about a price adjustment, but says there are funds in the account to cover the difference. Mark Upton repaired the steps in front of the church and should finish that project this week. Capital Campaign account will cut a check to the church for the completed work on the front bathroom performed by Saterlee Plumbing. Ron is getting bids to upgrade the security of the kitchen door to the alley. He will also get bids on the small upstairs bathroom for painting, tile (same as the other bathrooms upstairs) and installing the toilet that we have.

CPR Class is Sunday July 24th at noon. It will last 2 1/2 hours and the cost is \$45, due at time of class. Ron and Jacquie will provide a simple meal.

Membership Committee - no report

Old Business – Andy spoke with Alert360 in Springfield about electronic locks with fobs. The initial install cost and monthly fee was shared with vestry. (Not published at this time because we are still receiving bids) He will also check to see the cost for using the new system on more than the 2 parking lot doors. He will also get a second bid from Marmic, our current alarm system provider.

Building usage policy will be edited for simplicity. We will follow the policy going forward. Groups that meet must have a member who can let them in, monitor and lock up after.

- 2. Review our role as sponsor of the local Troop & Pack.

- 3. Need to coordinate church and BSA schedules

New Business – Harvest Happening: WOSP are planning to have on Oct 22, 2022. There will be up to 15 vendors, a chili feed with dessert, a bake sale and a raffle for different baskets.
