Join us Sunday, September 10, for WELCOME BACK SUNDAY! Summer vacations are over, school has started, and the Fall Church Program is just beginning. Several opportunities are available for you to grow spiritually, relationally and in community at St. Philip's Church this fall.

Theme: <u>Growing Healthy in Heart, Mind, and Spirit</u> will be a theme for our journey of faith this Fall. This journey includes young and old, singles, couples, families, and friends. Activities, service to others, Christian education for people of all ages, opportunities to serve at church and in the community, worship and prayer in church and in our homes will support this positive growth.

Important & Exciting Parish Updates



Dinner & Bingo Once-a-Month: Starting Wednesday September 13 at 6:00 pm we will be having once-a-month Dinner & Bingo nights in the parish hall! This idea came out of the retreat in August. The kids LOVED bingo and the parents thought it would be great to keep that going. These evenings are for everyone – all ages. And they will be an easy way for us to invite others to join us for fun & fellowship. The dinners should be easy meals (tacos, spaghetti, pizza, etc.). So, mark your calendars for the third Wednesday of each month and join in! September's meal will be sponsored by our Children's Ministry team. Please consider volunteering your church group (i.e., WOSP, vestry, choir, Altar Guild, etc.) to sponsor an upcoming month and let Kaie Stephenson or Deacon Carol know.

Wednesday Evening Chapel Services – New Start Time: Starting Wednesday Sept. 6th, chapel services will be moving to 5:30 pm (has been at 6:00).

Outreach Activity of the Month: WOSP and Outreach are partnering to focus our efforts on activities that help the needy and support families & children. So, this year each month will have one activity that the whole parish can support. August was children's backpacks. For September we are asking for donated items for Giving Bags (see list in parish hall) and Blankets. October will be Hats, Scarves & Gloves. Look for drop off stations in the parish hall.

Loving Our Neighbors: We have been in contact with Watered Gardens and soon will be signing up to, once each month, prepare a meal (at their kitchen) and serve the meal for 60-70 folks who show up to eat dinner at their outreach center. Each month we will put together a team to go to their site to do this. More details to come soon!

RAISE (Refugee and Immigrant Services & Education): Both Outreach and Children's Ministry have expressed an interest in us serving as a Welcome Team &/or ESL support for families re-locating to the Joplin area through the RAISE program. RAISE is a federal program with the goal of helping limited English speakers successfully relocate to our community. The goal is to help the families achieve self-sufficiency within 90 days. Families come from many locations such as Afghanistan, Ukraine, Haiti, etc. and they may be Christians, Muslim or of no religion. Other local partners include Crowder College and several local churches. More details to come soon!

Please Note: The last two items above are especially important because they are opportunities for us to interact with and develop relationships with those we seek to serve. While charity, (collecting and donating items for the needy) is important, to engage in a ministry of service some of what we do needs to be face-to-face with those we seek to serve. I'm excited that our parish is willing to engage in this type of ministry! The Holy Spirit is at work in our midst!

St Philip's Needs YOU!

September (the month when things gear back up again) is rapidly approaching! With Fr Ted and Philip both being out the past few weeks, the parish retreat and planning for the fall, etc. - we have been busy lately. So, now is a good time for all of us to re-examine how we might be called to serve and help support our parish family.

· Someone to wash all the acolyte robes (parents may want to do the ones their individual children have picked out).

· Folks to coordinate the meal for the Dinner & Bingo nights (See Kaie Stephenson or Stephanie Kumbier)

· Folks to help deliver things collected through one of the Outreach Activity of the Month projects (see Gail Campbell or Deacon Carol)

- \cdot People to clean out the garage and haul the stuff off.
- \cdot And we could always use more folks in the choir!

SAFE CHURCH COURSE – Required for ALL Key Holders

ALL KEY HOLDERS (Phone or Fob) for entry to St. Philip's Campus are required by the Denomination to have **SAFE CHURCH-Safe Communities Training.** This training addresses how we keep vulnerable people safe at church. Those we seek to protect include children, older adults and others. Keyholders take the basic training. People with other roles (choir director, secretary, organist, priest, deacon, etc.) have additional training.

PRAESIDIUM ACADEMY is the Episcopal Church's national provider for Safe Church training. Praesidium will email you a link to the online training. After finishing the training, can print your training certificates. Our church secretary, Kim Siers, will be able to print a transcript of all completed courses for every member who takes them for our records.



The training is required of all key holders. This requirement is new and is mandatory whether we use physical or digital keys. Ms. Siers can help you with the process if you want help. Jr. Warden, Andrew Campbell, has already completed his training. If you do not wish to do the training, we will need to have your fob back or your phone access to locks suspended.

September 2023 Rector Search Report from Vestry

- Parish Survey
 - The Vestry is working with Transition Minister, Fr. Chas Marks, to set up a Parish Survey to be completed by our members.
 - The Survey results will be used to build a Parish Profile.
 - The Profile is published in order to solicit applications from clergy interested in serving as St. Philip's next permanent rector.
 - The greater the participation in completing the survey, the better will be the results. These results support a clear and complete Parish Profile.
 - An accurate profile helps clergy applicants and Vestry recognize if the applicant and the parish are a good fit.
 - Expect more information about the survey later in September.
- Rector Search Committee
 - Fr. Marks has advised the Vestry that they should form the Rector Search Committee after the Parish Survey is completed.
 - Further information about the Search Committee and how to apply will be available in the October Newsletter.

PARISH HALL FOUNDATION

Nick Matta of Foundation Recovery Systems (FRS) made a presentation to the Vestry at the August 20, 2023 meeting about the pattern of settling in the parish hall that has resulted in wall cracks. Mr. Matta and Jr. Warden, Andy Campbell, shared about the need to stabilize the foundation of the Parish Hall with concrete piers down to bedrock.

Vestry members asked pertinent questions which were answered by Mr. Mata. Key points were:

- A pattern of foundation settling is present in the Parish Hall
- This pattern is showing significant damage to the building.
- The damage is in an early stage that allows for stabilization instead of remediation.
- Foundation Recovery Systems (FRS) proposal addresses all 4 sides of the building.
- FRS will monitor the building for settling with a laser on an annual basis and at our request for 5 years.
- We can add additional years of annual monitoring.
- The warranty is lifetime.
- Excavation next to the building is necessary and will be by hand.

Vestry considered two other bids. Company 1 only bid stabilizing the East side of the Parish Hall and Company 2 only addressed 3 sides.

Vestry approved a contract with FRS to stabilize the foundation as proposed. First Baptist Church of Camdenton, MO was contacted as a recent client of FRS. Mr. Littrel of First Baptist shared that the work was performed to their satisfaction, communication was good, and they recommend the company and would use them again.

EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED - STEWARDSHIP Program

Maria Dermot introduced the *Expect the Unexpected Project* to the Vestry at their regular meeting on Sunday, August 20. The *Expect the Unexpected Project* is designed to raise commitment to our church and fund the ministries of St. Philip's Church. Look for more information coming to you soon in many *Unexpected ways*. Think about *Unexpected ways* you can support St. Philip's Church. Who Knows? Maybe you are being called to work on the *Expect the Unexpected Team* with Maria and Fr. Ted to build a stronger church.

FAMILY FUN NIGHT

ABOUT OUR YOUTH

Shoal Kirk Youth/Family Retreat through the eyes of Brenner Kumbier

Friday, we got to the camp and picked out our bunk beds or loft area for sleeping. Several of us wanted to go fishing right away, so we did! Then after fishing we went to the pavilion to get the splash pad going, because it was hot. While the kids were running around playing, the adults were making dinner. Then we went back up to the lodge for bed, but people stayed up late. Saturday morning, we woke up to a great sausage and pancake breakfast that the moms made. Our Saturday included wiffle ball, fishing, swimming in the creek, learning about leaches (thanks for removing them from George's foot Deacon Carol), football, splash pad, and hiking. Then Saturday night we had outdoor church, hot dog and hamburger dinner, and bingo with prizes. Even though it was hot, Wayne and my dad still built a campfire for s'mores. GIVE IT A WHIRL

Whirl is a Lectionary Sunday School Program. This school year children K to grade 6 have the option to go to the classrooms during the service. From 10AM to about 10:40 the children will focus on a lesson that will be similar to what is going on in the service. Then during the peace children will return to the Sunday service with their parents.



The Whirl lesson will provide children a story, discussion,

short video and activity that follow the scripture used in the Sunday readings and homily. This gives the parents an opportunity to discuss the scripture with their children after church or during the week. In fact, the Whirl tools provide a pamphlet for children to take home that has ideas for activities and discussion with parents.

Just a peak, into the classroom on Sunday.

All children will begin in the same room. The children and teachers will read the scripture together. Then the children can watch the Whirl cartoon video together. This group will take 2-5 minutes to talk about how the cartoon connects to the scripture. Then the groups will split. One group of students, Kindergarten to grade two. The other group will be grade three to grade six. Each group will take 2-5 min to review and discuss the scripture and how it related to them at their age. Then each group will have an activity or craft that goes along with the lesson. The schedule for this lesson will be written in chronological order for the teachers each Sunday with a detail of the available resources.

In a very short time, the teachers and children will be very comfortable with the program.

YOU can follow a lesson and teach one Sunday each month!

Our goal is to have 2 classrooms during the service. One classroom will have Kindergarten to grade 2. The other classroom will have grade 3 to grade 6. Our goal is to have 4 adults each Sunday, or two adults in each classroom. If you can teach the same Sunday each month it will give our children consistency, which is important when they are learning about Jesus and an everlasting life.

This means we need 16 adults that have the desire to be part of the solution for where are children are now and where they are going.

In addition....

Bible stories and songs are used in the nursery for our babies and toddlers.

Maria Dermott moved to move Caleb Klingzing to the beginning of the agenda, Chris seconded. All in favor.

Caleb presented a handout about the need for organ repair/replacement. The technician and Caleb recommend replacing the keyboard. The price for a used keyboard is approximately \$1,000. Caleb also discussed the possibility of creating an organ fund to replace the current organ. He would like to be able to raise \$1,000 a month towards organ replacement.

Treasurer's Report – June 2023 Notes & Changes Greater Than \$1,000

TEC is resubmitting bid for the audio/visual improvements to include moving the streaming facilities to Acolyte room.

We now have an operating spigot by the church sign and the spigot outside of Fr. Ted's office will be fixed this week.
