## Why do we pray for the dead at St. Philip's Church?

Have you ever wondered why we pray for the dead in our Prayers of the People on Sundays? Here is an example from Prayer V, Rite II:

For all who have died in the communion of your Church, and those whose faith is known to you alone, that, with all the saints, they may have rest in that place where

there is no pain or grief, but life eternal, we pray to you, O Lord. BCP

You may have noticed that I often recite the names of my family members at this point in the prayers. We also specifically name our deceased loved ones in prayers on All Saints Day (Nov. 1), All Souls Day (Nov. 2), and All Saints Sunday (Sunday immediately following All Saints Day)? On page 9 in this Newsletter, there is a form for you to list your deceased loved ones to be remembered at the altar on All Saints Day (Wednesday, Nov 1) and All Saints Sunday (Sunday, Nov 5) this year. Please complete it and turn it in.

This practice is confusing to some Christians because they believe that salvation is fixed at the time of death. I would ask, when do we think God hears our prayers? Does God only hear the prayer when we utter it within our own temporal framework? Or does God, who is not constrained by time or space, hear and know our prayers before the creation of time and the universe? Ephesians 6:18 encourages us: "And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people."

Praying to the Dead? In Anglican/Episcopal spirituality, theology, and worship, we do NOT pray to the dead. And we don't listen for them to answer us from the grave. God alone can answer our prayers. But we do pray for the dead as you can tell from the prayers of the people in our prayer book. We also pray with the dead as you can tell from our ancient eucharistic prayers like this section of the prayer:

Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name: BCP

Every time we celebrate the Holy Eucharist, we join with all the living saints, and all those who have died, to pray and praise God in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. As St. Paul says in the 14th chapter of his epistle to the Romans:

We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves. If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. For to this end Christ died and lived again, so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living. Epistle to the Ephesians


In the epistle to the Hebrews, this mass of Saints who have gone to be with the Lord are referred to as "the great cloud of witnesses." We join with them in praising God.

## FROM OUR ORGANIST - CALEB



"Come, Labor On" is a hymn, set to the tune Ora Labora, that many of us know and love. It is hymn no. 541 in the hymnal 1982 and is one of my favorite hymn tunes. I had the pleasure of arranging a version of this hymn for SATB choir and premiered it at Saint Philip's on September 24, 2023. The text, written by Jane Laurie Borthwick (1813-1897) matched perfectly with the scripture (Mathew 20:1-16) for that Sunday due to the text discussing laboring throughout the day. While the Gospel reading for that Sunday was the opposite, stating how each of us gets an equal wage in heaven, this hymn suggests that we all need to put in our fair share of work to reach enlightenment in death. The text also serves as a metaphor for the harvest of souls from the Book of Revelation (Revelation: 14:14-20).

Many of you noticed that my arrangement of the hymn was not far removed from the original source material composed by Thomas Teritus Noble (1867-1953). The creation of this arrangement was simple: take an existing melody and wonderful accompaniment, and dress it up. This meant that the first two verses were unaltered from the original source material in terms of melodic and harmonic material. The difference between the original and my arrangement exists with the voicing. Noble has the voicing as Unison throughout. I elected to have the second verse be sung by the Tenors and Basses of the choir. The rationale for this came from the text itself as it discusses keeping watch (Mathew 24:42-44, Psalm 130:6).

The third verse is when my approach to the hymn begins to take form. Verse three is when all four voice parts are singing their individual four-part lines. The main melody is unchanged, however, the altos, tenors, and basses now sing in harmony against the sopranos. To further facilitate this, the organ is simplified and lends greater assistance to the choral parts.

Verse four was sopranos and altos singing the main melody. This has to do with their voice part being the higher ones, and it lined up with the text "claim the high calling." Underneath the sopranos and altos was a vastly altered organ part. Instead of beginning on an Ab major chord, the organ begins on a C minor chord, and complexity reharmonizes from the original accompaniment. For instance, the melody is hidden as various chord members and is often below what the organ was playing. This was to create an ethereal effect to match the mood of the text.

Verse five brings a brief return to the main melody and harmonies, however, shortly after the commencement of the verse a soprano countermelody took shape above the main melody. This melody was created using various chord and non-chord tones found within the melody and harmony of the verse. This lead allowed for a thickening of the texture of the work, and also a reharmonization using a B half-diminished 7 chord in the first inversion. This works well in this verse due to the text "till the long shadows, o'er our pathway lie." The final change within this verse was within the final chord, previous measures ended with an imperfect cadence which allowed for repetition. I changed this with the soprano counter-melody. Instead of ending on C with the rest of the choir, the sopranos ended on a high Ab allowing for a perfect authentic cadence to conclude the work.

One of the considerations I had when arranging this hymn-anthem for our choir, was making it as approachable as possible while still allowing for complexity and challenge. It was an act of love and a gift to be able to arrange this work for our choir, and I look forward to writing and arranging many more works for them in the future.



Pet exorcisms are by appointment only, no walk-ins!




#### DINNER AND BINGO NIGHT – WEDNESDAY – OCT 11<sup>TH</sup>

#### Coming in 2023 - New Website!



Andy Campbell led the invocation.

**Agenda** – <u>Judy Turner moved to adopt the agenda with additions and moving Dan Mata's presentation to start of meeting, Maria Dermott seconded.</u> All in favor. No abstention.

Additions to agenda for new business: Holy Cow Assessment and HR Team

Dan Mata with Foundation Recovery System gave a presentation of what they would do to stabilize the foundation of the Parish Hall building. They will hand dig and install 35 Settlestop Push Piers around the four sides of the building. They have a lifetime warranty and for the first 5 years will come and do an inspection to make sure the building hasn't moved any. After the 5 years we can choose to extend for an additional 5 years.

Have also received other bids. One for 3 sides of the building with a 10-year warranty and one for one side of the building.

Andy Campbell moved that we proceed with fixing the foundation, Chris Smiley seconded. All in favor. No abstentions

Andy Campbell moved that we accept Foundation Recovery Systems bid, Maria Dermott seconded. All in favor. No abstentions.

Maria Dermott moved to pay the 25% down out of the investment account and do financing of 0% Opayments for I year and then pay off the amount from the investment account, Andy Campbell seconded. All in favor. No abstentions.

**Last month's vestry minutes** – Maria moved to accept the agenda with correction on pg. 3 changing Rory to Jory, Chris smiley seconded. All in favor. No abstentions.

Treasurer's Report: July 2023 Notes & Changes Greater Than \$1,000

#### **Balance Sheet:**

- 1. Account #1110 SMB Checking Account down \$10,508.31 from June. The two key causes of this were Regular Support for Operations being down \$3,640 and a \$1,545 Columbarium disbursement.
- 2. Account #1120 Stifel Investment up \$13,572.50 from June. Account #1130 Stifel Endowment up \$17,750.00 from June.
- 3. Account #3129 Columbarium down \$1,545. \$1,545 check written to West Chestnut Monument in July for first half of 25 stones for Garden Columbarium.

#### **Income Statement:**

- 1. Account #4110 Pledge Payments down \$5,580.
- 2. Account #4115 Unpledged Donations up \$1,710.
- 3. Account #6110 Church Building Repairs & Main down \$1,048.49. \$511.93 was paid in July to Next Generation Plumbing for parts and labor for repair to hydrant.
- 4. Account #6040 Telephone and Account #6050 Internet Service were \$0 in July. The payments that would've normally been made in July were made August 2.
- 5. The \$979.50 Miscellaneous Administrative increase is a check written in July to the IRS for penalties due to untimely first quarter payroll tax payments that we have since started paying on time. There should not be any further IRS penalties for this reason.
- 6. Account #5710 Income and Distributions down \$1,935.27 and Account #5720 down \$10,451.27. However, the Stifel accounts have done well the last two months, helping to show an overall net income of \$8,339.39 through July 31.

Phil Metz moved to accept the financial reports, Maria Dermott seconded. All in favor. No abstentions.

Calendar – Maria Dermott moved to accept calendar with additions, Phil Metz seconded. All in favor. No abstentions.

Maria Dermott moved to accept bid #24992 move to Acolyte room and bid #24998 to replace soundboard, Blake Webster seconded. All in favor. No abstentions.

TEC fire additions: beam detector in church and heat detector by furnace in the basement

Phil moved to accept bid #24885 to install beam detector in church and heat detector by furnace in the basement, Maria Dermott seconded. All in favor. No abstentions.

Altar rail wobbly – possibly put in wooden supports. Windows in staircase to belfry need to possibly be taken out due to water damage and windows boarded up until can be repaired. Altar corners are sharp, see about rounding the corners and staining.

#### **Sr. Warden Report** – No report

**Deacon's Report** – Dcn. Carol reported that the Church Retreat was a great success. As a result of the retreat, we are going to start having Dinner & Bingo once a month on a Wednesday. Bingo was a huge hit with the kids.

Dcn. Carol will be having rotator cuff surgery on Sept 15<sup>th</sup> and will not be able to serve for 4-6 weeks. Gardens & Grounds: Deacon is asking the people who did Grace Episcopal Church in Carthage Garden to come over and look at our courtyard to see if they might have some suggestions. Also asking Dante our lawn guy for a quote to pull up the bushes on 7<sup>th</sup> street so we can plant grass instead.

Outreach: Maybe having a partnership with Watered Gardens and serving once a month there.

**Rector's Report** – Fr. Ted stated that Saturday mass at the church retreat was attended by 35 and we had at church on Sunday for mass was 55. May start partnering with Grace Church in Carthage for youth events.

Holy Cow Assessment: Andy Campbell moved to sign up for Holy Cow Assessment in Sept. with the cost up to \$1200.00 to be paid out of the investment account, Blake Webster seconded. All in favor. No abstentions. Phil will contact Fr. Chas Marks to get started.

Search Committee: Going to create an application that can be filled out and submitted to the vestry for consideration to be on the search committee.

HR Team: need to create a HR Team to look at jobs – descriptions/benefits etc. Possible candidate for committee Gayle Tuck.

Stewardship Program: Maria Dermott introduced the Expect the Unexpected Stewardship Program. Her presentation outlined steps designed to raise commitment to our church and fund the ministries of St. Philip's Church. Her proposal extends from September 2023 through 2024. Vestry was unanimous in accepting the proposal and to allocate funds to support the project. Ms. Dermott will work with Fr Estes to build a budget and recruit more team members.
