FROM FATHER TED



The day God created Hope was probably the same day he created Spring. - Bern Williams.

Spring has sprung upon us with a rush of Hope and activity in: gardens, graduations, hearts of young lovers, and the people of St. Philip the Apostle Church. The changing season prompts us to look to the future and take action to make our hopes and dreams a reality. Hope and action are visible in many places in our church life. **Where do you see these signs and how can you be involved in building the future?**

Our Rector Search Committee is working hard and has been meeting weekly to build a superb profile describing our church accurately and positively. The first draft looks great and is being tweaked to “get it just right.” The profile is a powerful tool for interested priests to learn about our church and discern whether they are called to enter the rector application process. It is our Hope that applicants will “fall in love” with this place and sense a clear “call from God” to serve with the people here. A rector is not an employee, but a vital ministry partner and leader for the parish. Please pray for your Search Committee as they do the work of discernment in finding the candidate God is calling to be in this amazing place. You can find the Rector Search Prayer on page 10 of this newsletter. **Will you commit to pray?**

The vestry and lay leadership is focused on developing strong teams and team leaders to serve our ministries. In the last 2 years, we have done much to grow and serve our community. But, as in all important endeavors, we can't just sit still. We either continue moving forward or we roll backwards. A Leadership Session on April 6, identified a list of teams and activities needed to keep our positive momentum going. Vestry members and lay leaders are contacting members to invite them to serve in leadership roles and ministries where they feel called. You may be asked to serve. I encourage you to **take the initiative and offer your gifts** to be used where they are needed. Greater involvement offers a deeper walk in faith, clearer sense of purpose, fuller relationships, and fun. Like a garden, our ministries offer the best growth when they are tended and nurtured. **Where are you called to serve?**

Come June 3rd, we won't have a rector, what are we going to do? The people of St. Philip's Church will continue being the church and living out our Baptismal Covenant in Joplin.

Our Baptismal Covenant calls us to:

- Continue the apostles' teaching and fellowship, Holy Communion, and the prayers.
- Proclaim the Good News of God in Christ.
- Seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbors as ourselves.
- Strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being.

Every element of the covenant, except presiding at Holy Communion, is the proper ministry of the lay people of our church. And even in Holy Communion, the priest cannot celebrate it alone. Sr. Warden, Kaie Stephenson, is working hard to schedule supply priests so that our weekly Eucharist may continue. Members will continue to serve and grow in their ministries. This season between rectors will have its challenges. But we are made stronger by rising to the challenge. A parish with strong lay leaders and powerful ministries will attract strong candidates for rector. **What gifts do you bring to this season?**

FROM DEACON CAROL

Pentecost – The Church’s Birthday – May 19, 2024



The following is taken from the book *Illuminated Life: Monastic Wisdom for Seekers of Light* by Joan Chittister, OSB:

Abba Lot went to see Abba Joseph and said to him, “Abba Joseph, as far as I am able, I say my little office, I keep my little fasts, I pray my little prayers, I meditate a little, I live in peace, and as far as I can, I purify my thoughts. What else can I do?” Then Abba Joseph stood up, lifted his hands toward heaven and spread out his fingers. His fingers then became like ten torches of flame, and he said to him, “Why not be turned completely into flame?” (pg. 135)

Chittister goes on to say, “Who can see God and live?” the ancients asked. It’s an important question. While we look for marks of our spiritual progress, the measure may well be in the question: Who can see God and live the same dull, directionless, complacent way they lived before God became the presence in life that makes all other presence relative? God is the energy that drives us, the torch that leads us, the life that beckons us, the Spirit within that carries us on – past every doubt, beyond every failure, despite every difficulty. To that energy there is no acceptable response but energy. Those who have no flame in their hearts for justice, no unrelenting understanding of the other, no consciousness of responsibility for the reign of God, no awareness of a prodding/nagging call to stretch themselves beyond themselves, no raging call to human community, no vision of beauty, no endurance for the daily-ness of it all – may indeed be seeking God, but God is still only an idea to them.

Strong words indeed! But I think Pentecost is the perfect time to reflect on all this. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red. Red helps us to recall that tongues of fire from the Holy Spirit that descended upon the Virgin Mary, the Apostles, and other disciples after the Ascension marking the beginning of the Church’s mission to the world (thus its birthday).

Red is also the liturgical color of feast days of the church when we remember the Apostles and martyrs with red being a symbol of their often-bloody passion (sufferings and death). Red is also often the liturgical color used at ordinations. And we invite everyone to wear red on Pentecost to remind us that each of us is a member of that Communion of Saints.

Red is the color of Christ’s blood and Episcopal churches often paint their doors red as a reminder of this and as a sign of refuge to others. We paint our doors red to let the world know what we stand for.

Pentecost is also a day that the church has designated for baptisms, and we are expecting to have some baptisms on Pentecost this year (Sunday May 19). On that day, we all will join those to be baptized, and their god parents, reciting and re-commit to our own Baptismal vows.

We are called to be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ in the world. We affirm this when we answer the questions: “Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ? Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself? Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?” To this, we answer, “We will, with God’s help.”

Let us pray an invocation of the Holy Spirit by John Henry Newman:

*Come, O Holy Spirit.
Come as Holy Fire and burn in us,
come as Holy Wind and cleanse us within,
come as Holy Light and lead us in the darkness,
come as Holy Truth and dispel our ignorance,
come as Holy Power and enable our weakness,
come as Holy Life and dwell in us.
Convict us, convert us, consecrate us,
until we are set free from the service of ourselves,
to be your servants to the world. Amen.*

As you reflect on all of this, think of us as those trick candles on a birthday cake that, when the world thinks it has blown us out, we come back to shine the light of Christ anew!



We have worked hard to create the Parish Profile and a Ministry Portfolio which are the documents that are used to share information about St. Philip's with prospective candidates. We also decided on questions that will be asked during the first interviews with candidates.

We understand that the Diocese has already received some inquiries about our position, so we are hopeful we will soon be able to begin the interview process.

- **Copies of the Search Committee prayer** can be found on the buffet in the parish hall – please take one and include it in your daily prayers.
- **The Executive Summary of the Holy Cow survey** can be found on the buffet in the parish hall – this is the summary that was shared by Gay Currence and Judy Turner during the listening sessions.

- **Wanted** – a few parish members will commit to plant and tend small portions of our vegetable garden. If several individuals or families take just a quarter of a bed as theirs, we will be able to have a functioning garden again. We will supply soaker hoses, mulch, and a combination lock to keep things secure – you just provide the plants and labor. This fenced-in garden is a wonderful, but non-utilized parish asset! Let's get it functioning again this Spring! Please let Deacon Carol or Kim know if you are willing to stake out and work a small portion of one the veg garden beds.

- **We are in need of ushers.** Can you please consider if this is something that you could do for St. Philip's? It is an important part of our Sunday service – visitors often need help and ALWAYS need a smiling face. Let Andy Campbell know if you are interested. This need is included in the Parish Life area mentioned on page 9 of this newsletter.

- Our greeter, Wyatt, has been welcoming and assisting individuals who need some extra help getting into the church. Wyatt is available at the parish hall door before and during the service and is able to allow people to enter after the doors are locked. His payment is being provided through donations at this time and has been funded through May 12th. The vestry will assess the effectiveness of the service and determine whether the service should continue after the trial period. 
