FROM DEACON CAROL



Spiritual Gardening

When I first visited St Philip's almost two years ago, I was dismayed to see the state of your gardens (courtyard and fenced veg garden). And when I attended some visioning sessions Fr. Ted held (I think they were called Ted Talks), I was also dismayed that when you all identified your priorities — updating your gardens and community outreach were not listed. I realized that over the years you all (especially WOSP) had been engaged in supporting a variety of worthy causes in town. And the fact that you even had garden spaces demonstrated that these had also been parish priorities at some point. You had just come through a lot; navigated COVID, long term pastor retired, and you were wrapping up a capital campaign.

You were in the process of re-envisioning who you were and what you wanted to accomplish. I believe God called me to serve as your deacon to help you revitalize you gardens and to take steps to be more intentional about your outreach activities so that the face you presented to the community would be more positive. There is a quote attributed to Alfred Austin, a British Poet Laureate, that says "Show me your garden and I'll tell you who you are." I believe this is a true saying. Your gardens are a metaphor for who you are, and they tell the community a lot about what the soul of this parish is.

Both gardening and outreach require you to be engaged on a personal level; to get your hands dirty so to speak. Both require you to look outside your walls. Both require teamwork. Both require you to be intentional and to have a plan. Both bear fruit if you do them well.

A lot of progress has been made and the courtyard garden is now full of new bushes and beautiful plants and shows that this parish is full of life. The outdoor columbarium area is in the process of becoming a more reverent, peaceful space. However, your vegetable garden says, "We still have work to do."

You have also made a lot of progress in your outreach activities. This is a generous, charitable congregation and you step up and donate money to many worthy causes. However, I sincerely believed you were ready to take the next step and live into your outreach calling in more direct, intentional, relational ways. You have demonstrated progress this past year by preparing and serving meals at Watered Gardens, by embracing our refugee family and by being sure we have snack bags to hand out to homeless folks who come to our doors for help. However, I believe there is more that you can do to serve those who live, work, and walk around our building and outdoor spaces.

Any garden will become overrun and look abandoned if left unattended. Our courtyard garden needs folks to help weed and water this summer. And I'm still hopeful that some of you will find partners to help us bring the vegetable garden back to life. I pray that almost all of you will serve at least once at Watered Gardens in the next few months. Over time more of you will hopefully become friends with our refugee family. We need a team of helpers to prepare snack bags for the homeless. We need a team of folks to help staff our church information booth at the monthly Makers Market.

And, over the summer as we search for our next rector, I urge you - if there is something about our parish, this church, our outdoor spaces, how we serve each other and those out in the community that bothers you – don't just complain about it – roll up your sleeves – find some helpers and plan to get more involved in positive, creative ways. Please let Kaie, or me, or any of the ministry coordinators know if you feel called to help in any way!

Let's all pitch in and tend our spiritual garden. Let's keep St. Philips' a beautiful place where all God's children are cherished and loved. Have a blessed summer! Deacon Carol

FROM OUR ORGANIST - CALEB



The music for the Second Sunday after Pentecost presents a theme of mercy and grace brought forth through the sacrifice of our savior, Jesus Christ. This is best presented in the sequence hymn and the two communion hymns for Corpus Christi Sunday. "God of Mercy, God of Grace" showcases Christ's mercy on his flock. The selected communion hymns discuss the mystery surrounding the Eucharist and Christ's physical manifestation therein.

The selections for the Third Sunday after Pentecost reiterate the theme of salvation with a special focus on the role that our faith plays therewith. This is best presented in

the sequence hymn, "Jerusalem, my happy Home" and "Jerusalem the Golden." These hymns showcase how even though we do not know what awaits us upon repose, we hold steadfast in our faith in the "Lamb of Galilee."

The Fourth Sunday's music further solidifies the theme from the Third Sunday. The Sequence Hymn, "We Walk by Faith, but not by Sight" is commonly associated with the Second Sunday after Easter or the Feast of St. Thomas. This is because it discusses how we don't need physical proof of Christ's resurrection for our devotion, unlike St. Thomas who infamously cried "My Lord and my God" upon physically touching Christ's wounds.

The selections for the Fifth Sunday expand on the theme of salvation through individual faith with an emphasis on the power Christ has in our lives and choices. One of the best representations of this is the hymn "Amazing Grace." There is a reason this hymn is sung at almost every Christian funeral – it tells how one's journey with God can indeed lead them home to our heavenly father.

FR. TED IS GONE - NOW WHAT?

Fr. Ted has retired! This is a happy occasion for him and Mindy and his family. He will have a well-earned opportunity to do what he enjoys. Just like St. Philip's they too will be in a period of transition. They are making plans for how to adjust to those changes. St. Philip's has had several months to prepare for our change. We know it will not be easy, but we also know we can do it.

Here are some things to remember:

- As Sr. Warden, Kaie Stephenson is now the primary leadership role of the parish. She is the first point of contact for questions and direction.
- We will have Sunday services:
 - Kaie is working diligently to secure supply priests for Sunday services. She has received commitments through July 7th.
 - Deacon Carol will be available to serve on some Sundays when a supply priest cannot be secured.
 - If there are Sundays when we have no supply priest and Dcn.
 Carol is not available, there will still be Sunday services, but without communion.
- We will have Wednesday services (see below)
- Deacon Carol will continue to be a valued leader in our parish, continuing to facilitate all that she has undertaken. Certainly, she will be a resource for Kaie and the parish, but she is not assuming the role of rector.
- The Search Committee is optimistic about potential candidates and eager to begin interviewing once applications are received and vetted by the Diocese.
- We ALL need to step up in leadership and other roles within the parish.
- We ALL need to lead by example.
- We ALL need to communicate.
- We ALL need to listen.
- We ALL need to share information.
- We ALL need to rely on one another.
- We ALL need to be kind to one another.





The Rev. Dr. Jim Lile has agreed to serve as supply priest for the 5:30pm Wednesday Eucharist in St. James Chapel beginning on June 5, 2024. Fr. Jim is no stranger to St. Philip the Apostle Church. 

The adult forum is winding down as summer approaches. The subject has been the book of Acts and the conversation has been engaging.





Call to Order/Roll Call: Fr. Estes called the meeting to order and the roll. A sufficient quorum was present to conduct business. Those in attendance are listed above.

Invocation: The Rector Search Prayer served as the invocation.

Agenda: Andy Campbell moved, and Maria Dermott seconded, adoption of the meeting agenda. Passed unanimously.

Previous Month's Vestry Minutes: <u>Judy Turner moved, and Tammy Macy seconded, approval of the March 18 Vestry Minutes.</u> Approval was passed by majority vote.

Treasurer's Report: March 2024 Notes & Changes Greater than \$1000

Balance Sheet:

- 1. Account #1110 SMB Checking Account up \$9,099.54 from February.
- 2. Account #1120 Stifel Investment up \$5,213.31 from February. Account #1130 Stifel Endowment up \$23,468.25. Account #1140 Stifel Bonds up \$946.78.
- 3. Account #2420 Payroll Taxes Withheld down \$2,742.44. 4th quarter 2023 Missouri payroll withholding payment of \$1,342 was made in March and I made an adjustment of \$742 to lower Missouri withholding liability as the 3rd quarter 2023 Missouri withholding payment was originally not recorded to reduce the liability, but instead was recorded as an expense. Another reason the Payroll Taxes Withheld liability is down from February is due to employees who are paid on a monthly basis not being issued March paychecks. The paychecks were issued in early April.
- 4. Account #3129 Columbarium 709 down \$2,351.63. The main reason for this change is due to \$3,000 of \$6,437.50 check to 3D Lawn & Landscaping coming out of this account.

Income Statement:

- 1. Account #4110 Pledge Payments up \$18,095.
- 2. Account #4115 Unpledged Donations up \$2,017.
- 3. Account #4130 Easter/Lenten Income up \$2,304.
- 4. Account #6020 Gas Service down \$1,224.69. Two payments in February is the cause of this decrease.
- 5. Account #6120 Grounds Maintenance up \$4,063.37. The main reason for this change is due to \$3,437.50 of a \$6,437.50 check to 3D Lawn & Landscaping coming out of this account.
- 6. Account #6140 Property Insurance down \$2,527.50.
- 7. Account #6410 Rector Salary down \$5,791.67, March paycheck written on April 4.
- 8. Account #6420 Rector Housing down \$1,000. This is included on March paycheck written on April 4.
- 9. Account #6510 Lay Employee Wages down \$1,893.52. This corresponds with earlier note about payroll tax liability being down. Monthly paid employees did not receive March paycheck, as they were paid in early April.
- 10. Account #5710 Income and Distributions up \$1,630.98 and Account #5720 Change in Securities Value up \$6,969.36.
