

FROM DEACON CAROL



During This" In-Between" Season

Dear Parish Family: We are currently in the Season After Pentecost (also called Ordinary Time). It's the long green season between the Day of Pentecost and the First Sunday of Advent. This season of the church year could be described as the time we live in now: the time between Pentecost all those years ago and the Advent to come— Christ's second coming in the future. So, we (the Universal Church) are, in fact, living in an "in-between time" on a cosmic level right now. It also seems appropriate to think about this on a bit more local level since we here at St. Philip's have also entered an "in-between time" with the exit of our Interim Priest Fr. Ted

Estes and the eventual arrival of our new (not yet called) rector.

So, it might be useful for us to examine the current *Season After Pentecost* through its four general themes:

- Our relationship with God
- Our relationship with Jesus Christ and one another
- · The presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives
- The Church and its mission.

During the Season After Pentecost, on Sunday mornings' gospel readings we hear the Sermon on the Mount and many of the parables. We hear Jesus's teachings on prayer, possessions, relationships, and the practice of justice. We see him healing the sick, the lame, the demon-possessed, and the dying. And like the multitudes who gathered around him, we witness miracles – the feeding of the five thousand and the calming of the storm in the Sea of Galilee. Listen closely to the Sunday Gospel readings; they are important because through them Jesus is instructing us about what it means to be Christians!

This season is a good time for each of us to ask ourselves the following questions: "How do I live out Christ's call to me to follow him? How do I demonstrate in thought, word, and deed my love of God – in my home, in our parish, and in the world? Am I open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit? How can I be a force-for-good, a faithful Ambassador of Christ, bring about healing and help to build-up the Body of Christ?"

Let's take every opportunity during this current "in-between time" at St. Philip's to support, nourish, and build-up our parish family (show up on Sunday mornings, continue being the generous people that you are, participate in meetings and special events). Let's focus on all the positive things about our church (we have a lot we can feel good about). Let's work to improve and maintain our facilities (clean out, clean up, and organize all our workspaces) and care for our grounds (continue watering & weeding). Let's be sure that our new rector comes into a healthy, positive, vibrant parish filled with people who love and worship God, love their neighbors, and are clearly focused on serving Christ by serving others!

Collect for Proper 17 (BCP 233)

Lord of all power and might, the author and giver of all good things: Graft in our hearts the love of your Name; increase in us true religion; nourish us with all goodness; and bring forth in us the fruit of good works.

FROM OUR ORGANIST - CALEB



June's music consistently presented a theme of salvation through personal faith; however, July's hymn selection moves things in a slightly different direction. For instance, a general theme throughout ordinary time is Praise to the Lord, and that is the musical theme for almost every element of the music in July.

The first week of July kicks off the theme of "Praise to the Lord" with one our congregation's favorite hymns, "Praise to the Lord the Almighty." This great hymn tells the singer and listeners about all of God's great wonders and joys. The congregational offertory, "How Firm a Foundation" reminds us that Christ is the foundation of our lives

and faith. The communion meditation, "Hail, true victim, life and light" is a Roman Catholic communion hymn that emphasizes the power of Christ and his presence in the sacrament of communion. The closing hymn, "Hail to the Lord's anointed" has been sung several times this season, but I keep coming back to it because in this case, it again emphasizes our praise to God, and our creator's praises upon the anointed one.

The second Sunday's music has hymns that further the theme of Praise to the Lord, but with a slight change in direction towards asking for Christ's continued presence in our lives. The opening and closing hymns, "Lift up your heads, ye mighty gates" and "Come thou fount," respectively, do this with language such as "Redeemer, come! I open wide, my heart to thee: here, Lord abide!" and "Let thy goodness, like a fetter, bind my wandering heart to thee." (For a more in-depth analysis of the text of "Come thou fount" I recommend looking at my newsletter article from last July, feel free to contact me for a copy of this). The offertory voluntary is Bach's arrangement of the Lutheran hymn *Gott sei gelobet und gebenedeiet* and is be translated as "God be praised and blessed."

The Third Sunday in July can be summarized as Praise to the Lord through Christ's foundation in our respective lives. Every single hymn for this Sunday presents this theme, from "Christ is made the sure foundation" to "I come with Joy" to "Savior, again to thy dear Name we raise" all present this theme and dive further to showcase it.

The final Sunday in July presents the theme of Praise to the Lord through our actions in the name of Christ. This is presented in the first hymn of the day, "Lord you gave the great commission" which has the line "to heal the sick... Father what they do, forgive... I am with you to the end." The next pieces of music tell us to remember while we serve, that we must trust God to guide us in our service and ministry.

WOSP MEETING JULY 27th - 10:30AM








Agenda: Fr. Ted proposed moving Roof Repair Proposal to start of meeting. Tammy Macy moved that the Roof Repair

Proposal move to the start of the meeting,

Chris Smiley seconded. All in favor, no abstentions.

Maria Dermott moved to adopt agenda as amended, Andrew Campbell seconded. All in favor. No abstention.

Roof Repair Proposal – RestoreMasters presentation regarding Church Clay Tile Roof by Olivia Kraft, Chris Branstetter and Adam Engel. They would physically inspect the roof to see how much damage there was and, if warranted, would reopen our previous insurance claim for roof damage. They only charge if the insurance claim pays out. They would collect 10% which they lowered from 15%.

After they left discussion was held.

Chris Smiley moved to accept the contract with RestorMasters at 10%, Tammy Macy seconded. Six in favor with one abstention by Kaie Stephenson.

Last Month's Vestry Minutes – Chris Smiley moved to adopt the Vestry minutes, Maria Dermott seconded. Six in favor, with one abstention by Calvin Cassady because he was not present in the meeting under consideration.
